

ATTORNEY FOR WALLACE COUNTY
DIVERSION FUND SCHOLARSHIP

The Wallace County Attorney Diversion Fund Scholarship will award one (1) scholarship to a graduating senior from a Wallace County High School who will attend an accredited college. Once the scholarship is awarded, it will be paid directly to the financial aid office of the student's college, in one installment of \$500 *at the beginning of the second semester* of college, if the student maintains a C average during the first semester. Accordingly, the student will have to provide a certified transcript of the student's first semester grades. The intent is to help fund the education of students who have helped others in the community and the school and who are planning on pursuing a career relating to criminal justice through their studies such as law, social work, psychology, juvenile justice, law enforcement, etc.

Selection Procedure

Each graduating senior of a Wallace County High School will be eligible to make an application. An April 1st application deadline will be set each year.

Selection Criteria

- a. Citizenship
- b. Leadership abilities
- c. Character
- d. Involvement in school and community activities that serve others
- e. Desire to pursue studies in the criminal justice field

Personal Information

To apply for this scholarship, submit, in a typed, resume format, the following information to Wallace County Attorney-SCHOLARSHIP, 113 W. Greeley Ave., P.O. Box 429, Tribune, KS 67879:

- Name, mailing address, parent's names and occupations, names and ages of other household members including any attending college;
- Various high school activities and offices held, special honors, and awards;
- Jobs held during high school, employers, and manager/supervisor contact information; and
- Intended college and specific field of study.

Also, be sure to include the following with your personal information:

- Official copy of high school transcripts;
- One letter of recommendation that speaks to applicant's citizenship and service to others; and
- Applicant's short description, in 250 words or less, of why the applicant is interested in a career in criminal justice or relating to criminal justice.
